Description and Purpose

Percussion Pedagogy is designed to help future applied teachers develop skills necessary to be successful. While the teaching projects will focus on applied teaching, groups instruction will be required. It is required for Percussion Performance and Music Education majors and intended to be taken in conjunction with MUL 4460 (Percussion Literature).

Policies

Students are expected to attend all class sessions. Students will keep a notebook detailing procedures. Students must have access to some type of video and audio recording devices. Some presentations will be recorded outside of class and presented during class time.

Week 5-7 Timpani pedagogy, presentation 2

Week 8-11 Keyboard pedagogy, presentation 3

Week 12-14 Drumset pedagogy

Week 15 Final presentation

Assessment

Teaching presentations 80% (4@20% each)

These presentations will be recorded lessons or teaching experiences that will be watched by the entire class. Feedback will be given and coaching will follow to illuminate areas of improvement. The delivery of content and application of concepts will be assessed.

Attendance/participation 20%

Weekly the class members will present teaching elements to one another to practice methodologies before applying these to recorded teaching projects.
