Jacaré Brazil is the most diverse performance ensemble within a university performing arts program, focusing on the musical traditions of Brazil. The ensemble features various instruments and sections, including percussion, vocals, guitar, and other instruments. Each semester, specific repertoires blend these sections into unique groups that often include faculty and students—both undergraduate and graduate—within the School of Music, other campus units, and the wider music community. International guest artists frequently perform with the group, creating a rich and diverse environment for artistic and cultural collaboration.

OBJECTIVES

The ensemble is committed to exploring a variety of Brazilian repertoires through musical practice and performance. Direct engagement with the world music ensemble offers a unique opportunity to enhance students' global and intercultural awareness, cultivating an understanding of other cultures through hands-on music experiences.

Sometimes, written music will be provided; other times, you will need to learn your part by ear.
