Course Description:

Opera Workshop develops a student's performance and related professional skills specific to the creation of musical dramas. Repertoire will include rehearsals for musical and character development.

Course Goals:

1. To experience firsthand the performance practice of musical drama.
2. To develop professional rehearsal skills, etiquette, and the ability to work well within a group.
3. To improve stage confidence and movement.
4. To develop the ability to analyze characters, music, and libretti.
5. To develop an overall understanding of opera repertoire.

Required Materials:

1. Music: score must be purchased by the singers or downloaded from IMSLP

**The Pirates of Penzance – G. Schirmer Edition*

2. Computer with Audio and Video (Zoom) applications
3. Class Attire: comfortable, loose-fitting clothing. T-Shirts and sweatpants are welcome.
4. Rehearsal Staging Attire: Rehearsal skirts, shoes, long pants, etc.
5. Audio Recorder at coachings and musical rehearsals

Notes:

1. We may be singing in Italian, French, German, and English. Be sure to check in advance if your scenes are in the original language or an English translation.
2. Be sure to register for the appropriate class in Music (Ex: Opera Workshop MUO3503)
3. Please know that you may be asked to make temporary physical changes to correctly portray the character for your role. Some of these changes may be:
 - Facial and body hair
 - Clothing that may be gender specific and appropriate to the era and story
 - Length and color of hair
 - Covering of tattoos

- Removal of jewelry
- Heels and lifts
- Contacts if you wear glasses
- Wigs and make-up

Intimacy:

Hugging, hand holding, possible kissing, combat, and general physical contact may be part of a director's staging. Performing artists are expected to be open to direction, so all members develop skills, language, and performance practice understandings. Directors will be in close communication with artists, will provide training, will give situationally specified choreography, and will be open to discussion.

Opera Theatre Workshop is a performance-based course. Students will be graded on their final public performance(s) and/or performance video creation.

Attendance/Grading/Policy:

Professionalism, collegiality, and participation in each class period are important to the curriculum requirements of this course. Therefore, attendance and active engagement are required. Two late arrivals at a rehearsal are counted as one absence. Unless excused, each absence beyond one absence will result in a lowering of one letter grade. These two absences would be equivalent to missing a week of class. Excused absences are limited to medical illness documented by a physician, family emergency documented by the appropriate person and religious holidays. You are responsible for all material missed. Check syllabus and class schedule on material covered in case of any absence.

- Rehearsals are safe places to experiment, make bold choices, and create expressive theatre with your colleagues.
- Images or video recordings of these rehearsals being archived or posted on social media are counterproductive and not allowed.
- Once the piece is ready for public performance, pictures and video will be allowed but ONLY with the permission of everyone in the scene.
- Some scenes will be recorded as a teaching tool but only shown in class.
